Now Barbara will have time to reflect on all the beautiful countries they visited in the world and the special memories. In 1960 my father helped build Caloola Ski Lodge at Smiggins Hole, Kosciuszko. He taught us all to ski and still today I am a member of the Caloola Lodge. RIP Dad.

On January 28th, 2022 Ruby (Rubenesque) passed away. He was retired in the Mornington Peninsula after a short time with Stella Barton (Grade 1 Para rider). I bought Rudy when he was 8 months old after a call from Emma Mason. I called into Lochinvar to see him on my way back from a competition. I had to see him move, but he couldn't really even lead properly, so I told Emma I would come back in a week to see if he would then run on a lead, so that I could see if he moved straight.

Well, one week later, he ran up and down the outdoor arena and was soon loaded on the truck. Rudy was never going to represent Australia, but he was going to let me train him to Grand Prix and compete at State and National Championships, and CDIs at Sydney, Boneo and Queensland. I am entirely grateful for the experiences I have had and I truly loved this horse. I hope one day I can ride his last freestyle test on another Grand Prix horse. The test is hard, the music I love, and I hope the opportunity may come again. RIP Rudy.

On a brighter note, I competed Roseman at the local HVDA T-shirt day. I prepared him to cope with the heat, with quick warm ups. Well, it worked. $81.389 \%$ in the 4A and $67.93 \%$ in the 4 B . He truly embraced the 4 A test and it was wonderful. A great start to the year, coming home with two firsts.


Also competing at the HVDA T-shirt day from HVEC was Orla on Rocky Hill Tudor (Teddy) at Teddy's first ever dressage competition, and also with Rouge D Armour (Red), Enda on Beau \& Arrows (Beau) and Sally on Florencia. We all had a good day and went home with lots of homework. It was great to be out and about learning, competing and catching up with friends. Roseman was really happy because Teddy travelled on the truck with him, and Teddy was happy having Roseman to keep him company at his first competition.

Some owners have left because they purchased new properties. Good luck! The work involved in maintaining these properties is unbelievable.
