Another very busy month for everyone. School holidays, National Dressage Championships, Coach Education, birthdays and the end of year preparations for the HVEC Christmas Party, foals and a special baby.

Roseman has only ever competed in the Hunter Valley, so I knew this would be a big challenge. He was brave, he tried hard, but unfortunately tension affected our performance. He is a big horse, approximately 17.2 hh and I'm only 5'4 so manoeuvring a not so confident Roseman around the Medium 4.2 and 4.3 tests required skill, strength and experience. Kaitlyn did a great job as head groom, Roseman really held it together and I loved competing at a big competition again. Onwards and upwards from here for 2025.

Some riders have new horses so these full days offer more time for learning, training, social interaction and keep the coach fine tuned on teaching groups. All the young riders, whether they have their own ponies or not, love coming for the whole day to spend more time with either their own horses and ponies or the HVEC ponies Alaska and Clancy. Some of the riders were preparing for the Alexander Park Dressage Club Championship event, so fine tuning their dressage tests was a priority.

"Regardez Moi was born on 18th June 1996 - he was 28 years, 4 months and 10 days old.

For me he was everything - such a legend.

He won more than 40 Grand Prix starts. On three occasions he was the Australian Grand Prix Champion.

Regardez Moi represented Australia in 2009 at the World Cup Finals in Las Vegas, USA. It seems a life time ago that Regardez Moi and I would charge into the arena to the roar of spectators who were packed to the ceiling. Not even any standing room available! The crowd loved Regardez Moi and would start clapping before he even entered the arena. He was like a rock star and I didn't think the times would ever end.

Regardez Moi rocked from Queensland to the Sydney CDI and down to the Melbourne Internationals. Regardez Moi won the Equitana Freestyle on five different occasions. He was iconic. "
